## Letter from School Place

Following my visit to Kalisgarth last month, it was encouraging to attend a public meeting at which a group was formed to explore ways to get a similar care home established in Sanday. From the Council's perspective, the creation of such a facility would accord with all of "Our Values": "Promoting survival", "Promoting sustainability", "Promoting equality and fairness", "Working together", "Working with communities" and "Working to provide better services", and would meet our priority no.1 "Care and support for those who need it" and priority no.2 "Promote successful, thriving communities" (see *Wur Plan*, available from the Council Offices or downloadable at [http://www.orkney.gov.uk/Files/Council/Council-Plans/Our\\_Plan\\_2013-2018.pdf](http://www.orkney.gov.uk/Files/Council/Council-Plans/Our_Plan_2013-2018.pdf)).

To remind you, Kalisgarth provides residential care, day care and respite care, employs some 20 staff and offers training opportunities, meaning old and young alike are able to remain on Westray who otherwise would have to leave the island.

OIC is undertaking a review of home-based registrars. I would urge everyone to take part, whether or not you have ever needed a registrar so far in your life. You can do it online at: <https://www.surveymonkey.com/r/islesregistrars>.

Returning to the values and priorities of *Wur Plan* mentioned above, these are my thoughts:

- In the absence of home-based registrars in the Isles, a newly bereaved person would be forced to endure a day away from home travelling to Kirkwall and back in order to register the death before the deceased can finally be laid to rest. (No Mainlander has to suffer this inconvenience.)
- Family history research is a major industry these days, and genealogists will travel out to our island registrars to search the registers they hold. Such a visit may well be combined with a trip to the island graveyards, a tour around the island to find the dwellings of ancestors, a browse in the local heritage centre, a meal at the pub, etc., all contributing a little much-needed money into the island economy. Centralising the registrars will remove this contribution, quite apart from making the island registrars redundant and taking away a source of income from them, yet further chipping away at the sustainability and ultimately the survival of our fragile island communities.
- A few years ago I visited the North Frisian island of Pellworm. On that island, marriage ceremonies are regularly held (around 300 each year!) in the lighthouse, supporting booming business for local hostelrys and accommodation providers, and spawning a "wedding industry" on the island. I could imagine such an enterprise developing on North Ronaldsay, for example, but this would only be feasible with a resident registrar.

Community councils are automatically engaged in this consultation, but I would encourage development trusts and heritage groups also to consider making submissions on their own behalf.

NB The deadline for submissions is the 9<sup>th</sup> December

Those I have attended include meetings of the: Community Development Fund Sub-Committee, St Magnus Cathedral Sub-Committee, Change Programme Board, Orkney College Management Council, House Build Programme Board, plus some council seminars, the AGM of the Sanday Development Trust, and the meeting of the Education, Leisure & Housing Committee (as vice-chair).

In my role as Vice-Chair of Education, Leisure & Housing, I would welcome hearing (in confidence, of course) from pupils, students, parents, teachers (and aspiring teachers) and other staff with any comments they may have on the service, good or bad.

### **Board Update**

Thank you to all those who attended our Annual General Meeting on 7 November 2015.

Following a ballot by the members present, the following were duly elected to the Board: Diana Compton (re-elected); John Garson (re-elected); Carole Maguire; Kayleigh Tipper (re-elected).

The Board wishes to thank both Maureen Flaws and Sheena Marwick for their input as Directors, after they both stood down from the Board prior to the AGM.

### **REWDT Car Club**

The Development Trust is operating a FREE TRIAL PERIOD until 31/12/2015 where both membership of the Car Club and car hire is free. During this trial, hire durations may be limited to allow others to use the vehicle.

The new car is available for members of the Car Club to hire for as little as 1 hour or for as long as is needed. The car now sports its logos for the Car Club.

To become a member of the Car Club:

- You need to be aged over 21 and under 75 years old and have held a licence for at least 2 years. Drivers over 75 will be referred to the insurers.
- You can not have been convicted for a serious driving offence
- You need to have a full EU driver's licence with a maximum endorsement of 6pts. Non-EU license holders will need to be referred to the insurers.

Application forms, a list of Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs) and Terms and Conditions are available from the Trust's Offices, or from our new website. Now that the paper copies of driving licences are no longer valid, applications should be accompanied by details of your driving record which can be obtained from the DVLA website at [www.gov.uk/view-driving-licence](http://www.gov.uk/view-driving-licence). If you need help with obtaining this, just contact us.

### **Brinian Playpark**

The Trust has submitted the application form for Planning Permission to build a play park at the bottom of the allotment site in Brinian. At time of writing, we are still awaiting confirmation that we can start building the new play park, and this is scheduled to commence mid-December.

We know it will be tempting, especially when the children are on holiday, but we respectfully ask that while the building work is happening up to the official opening day of the park, that the children refrain from playing there for health & safety reasons for which the Trust will not be held responsible. We will keep you informed of developments as they occur.

### **Demand Side Management - Heat Smart Orkney**

Our American technical partners have now received the CE conformity marking for their equipment, and we await the availability of the installer for those households taking part in the trial.
