The home energy report and thermal imaging part of the Affordable Warmth Project has now been rolled out to 84 homes across Rousay, Egilsay and Wyre and there are a still a few homes left to visit. At this stage we know there will be some funding left after offering visits to all pri-

mary homes across the islands, and we are now in a position to offer an energy report and thermal imaging to second homeowners on a first-come-first-served basis. Those who have second homes in Rousay, Egilsay and Wyre and would like to benefit from this project, please contact Michelle on 821 420 by Friday, 9th. April at the latest.

As many of you know from your visit, the project also helps homeowners to identify what grants are available to help make our homes more affordably warm through insulation or other measures. As a reminder for those people we have already seen, and for those we have yet to see, these grants include:-

The Energy Assistance Package, a Scottish Government grant operated by the Energy Saving Trust in conjunction with Scottish Gas, where homeowners/private sector tenants can benefit from improved insulation and, in some cases, from an updated central heating system. For more information on this grant, contact the Energy Savings Scotland Advice Centre on 0800 512 012 or visit www.eneryassistancepackage.com.

The Carbon Emissions Reduction Target, operated by Keep Orkney Warm, is where homeowners/private sector tenants can benefit from grants towards improving the insulation in their lofts and cavity walls. Everyone is eligible for some funding from this grant. For more information call 01856 870 536.

Orkney Action for Warmer Homes, a new OIC grant, which can provide substantial assistance to home owners who spend more than 10% of their income on fuel to heat their homes. For an application form for OAWH call the Orkney Energy Agency on 01856 870 534.

The Microgeneration Certification Scheme has changed very recently. This scheme can provide a grant of up to 30% of the accredited installation costs of a renewable heating system, e.g. a ground source or air source heat pump; or a <u>loan</u> of up to £4000 towards an accredited installation of a renewable electricity system such as wind or hydro turbines or photovoltaic cells.

We are still awaiting the news of our other Powerdown projects (Community Gardening, Carbon Neutral Transport and Reduce, Reuse, Recycle). The Climate Challenge Fund panel have met and deliberated over 150 projects from communities just like ours across Scotland. None of us have heard anything yet.
