Development Trust News

Planning permission was granted on 5th November for the Community Turbine, and work is underway to finalise the National Grid connection. Anne (821283) is currently working on an application to the Big Lottery Fund to secure a large part of the funding required to install the Turbine. As part of this process we have to indicate ways in which the money raised will be used to help the community. At the moment this is being based on the priorities identified in the draft Development Plan. As always, you are encouraged to get in touch if there is anything particular you would like to see done.

The Trust has been successful for a second year in securing £2,500 from the Fairer Scotland Fund to cover its general running costs, and is supporting Stronsay Development Trust's bid to administer the Fund on behalf of all the Orkney Development Trusts for 2009-10.

An application is on its way to the Climate Challenge Fund, which, if successful, will allow us to create another part-time job on the islands, as well as potentially funding energy-efficiency and recycling programmes.
