# **Community Update - March 2014**

# **Swimming Pool Feasibility Study**

For the community

We have appointed consultants ('Alan Jones Associates') to conduct a feasibility study on the possibility of building a swimming pool and leisure complex (the joint-second-place project identified from our Community Survey). We will soon be sending a survey to the community, and we hope that you will help us to assess demand for this project by completing this short survey.

# Infrastructure and Innovation Fund (Under CARES)

The Development Trust has been awarded £39,075 to test technology to introduce a new electrical demand when our turbine is being curtailed. We are now working on getting a feasibility study carried out so that we can put this in place as soon as possible, as the project has a very tight timescale.

### **RSPB Summer Festival**

The Trust is currently working with the RSPB to hold a summer festival on Rousay, Egilsay & Wyre, on 14-15 May.

# **Community Broadband Fund**

BT has finally announced the post codes where they will be putting super fast broadband. We now know that this will not include Rousay, Egilsay & Wyre.

However, with that news comes the support of the Community Broadband Fund. Information we have started gathering will go towards submitting an application for funding, but the more information we can get, the better our application. Therefore, if you are yet to complete the broadband speed form, please will you do so as soon as possible. We are already inviting tender applications for a technical study into what infrastructure we will need to be able to provide superfast broadband across our islands.

# 'Preferred Contractors' Wanted

A position(s) has arisen for preferred contractor services working for Rousay, Egilsay & Wyre Development Trust.

Duties will initially include general maintenance of the Community Garden at Rousay Community School to include fixing fences, painting fences and the shed, mending the polytunnel, deck cleaning, maintenance and common area weeding of the school garden.

Other duties may include general maintenance at the Rousay Allotment Association site in the Pier area (including repairs to the poly-tunnel); and any other future project sites, as determined by the Board of Directors.

Suitable candidates must be able to attend the Development Trust project sites on Rousay, Egilsay & Wyre to perform these and other tasks.

No formal qualifications are required but the successful applicant will be expected to complete manual work outdoors. Necessary training can be provided if more complex tasks are required.

The successful contractor(s) will be paid upon receipt of invoices, within 30 days of the date of receipt. This position is 'ad hoc' and therefore the successful applicant will be registered as self-employed.

The successful contractor(s) can expect to earn an hourly rate of £10.00 per hour (please note the Development Trust is not VAT-registered).

# **Letter from School Place**

A new record on shortness of meetings was achieved at the Special General Meeting on the new hospital, which was all over in less than three minutes. I hope Kyle Brown (from Sanday), who was in the public gallery on work experience with Radio Orkney, did not get the impression that all Council meetings are like that (if only!).

At the Education, Leisure & Housing Committee meeting (wearing my Sanday Community School hoodie\*), I voiced my concerns over underspends in education. If a budget has been set, there is nothing virtuous in the department not spending it, especially when schools are under pressure from the introduction of the Curriculum for Excellence and the need to obtain resources for the new examination system.

A seminar was held on the issue of lengthening the weekend at home for Isles' KGS pupils. It is a difficult circle to square, with many knock-on consequences. The various options will soon be going out for consultation. The same afternoon, I was given my own personal tour of the new Papdale Halls. They are splendid accommodation, far better than any I experienced at university.

At a special Policy & Resources Committee meeting on the setting of the 2014/2015 Council budget, I collaborated with Cllr Russ Madge on an amendment requesting, among other things, additional funding for the internal ferry and air services. We ended up being in a minority of two! We also supported Maurice Davidson's and Owen Tierney's amendment to scrap a £65,000 cut to the ferry budget, but that garnered no support from other councillors either.

At our normal Policy & Resources Committee meeting, I advocated that OIC should provide a "special collection" for postal votes to give voters longer to consider who to vote for (and candidates longer to canvass them). It was agreed to look into this in time for the General Election in 2015.

Along with community council transport reps from the North and the South Isles, I attended the Inter-Isles Air and Ferry Services Consultative Forums. In line with the public's preference, it was agreed to base next year's refit timetable for the outer North Isles on the draft made widely available before the meeting (which itself was based on the two-boat timetables used during the dispute last year). An attempt is also going to be made this year to improve the signage at Kirkwall pier.

"Your Islands Your Future" has now been published and was distributed in The Orcadian of the 13<sup>th</sup> February. For those of you who don't read The Orcadian, copies are available on request from OIC. Public events will be held in the coming weeks. All Isles' community councillors have been invited to attend a meeting specially for them on the 3<sup>rd</sup> March, held at a time to fit in with the transport links. (At my request, OIC will cover the community councillors' travel expenses, and they'll get lunch.) You are encouraged to contact them with any of your thoughts and ideas to raise at the meeting. # **Rousay War Memorial**

Quotes are requested for the following work to be carried out on the Rousay War Memorial, for this the centenary year of the First World War.

- Lightly clean memorial and paths to remove algae, moss and debris, being sure not to damage the stonework. Biocides are unlikely to be required.
- Fill cracks in cement (on pedestal, path and boundary wall) using a mix of similar colour and hardness. Where larger repairs are required consider casting sections in situ.
- Repoint stone boundary wall using lime mortar.
- Remove vegetation from boundary wall, ensure wall is clear of debris to allow adequate vegetation.
- Repaint cast-iron boundary railings.
- Ensure entrance gate opens easily.

# **Egilsay War Memorial**

Quotes are requested for the following work to be carried out on the Egilsay War Memorial, for this the centenary year of the First World War.

- Repoint carefully with lime mortar where necessary, using a carefully chosen mix.
- Carefully remove lichen, moss and grass, being sure not to damage stonework.
- Re-lay surrounding base, ensuring that there are adequate foundations to prevent subsidence, and adequate drainage arrangements to prevent water collecting (which leads to vegetation growth).
- Repair or relay cement paving.
