KINGARLY HILL COMMUNITY WIND TURBINE

This project is now entering the crucial stage of seeking a formal offer of loan from Co-operative Bank. A formal offer means we can progress to a procedure referred to as Due Diligence where we need to start appointing construction contractors. The bank will not release funds for our loan, which will let us get on with actually building the turbine, until all contracts are in place. To aid us in this process, the 5 island groups who are each proceeding with community wind turbines have appointed Northwind Associates Ltd as the Joint Project Managers to assist in the contracting of the appropriate civil engineering firms.

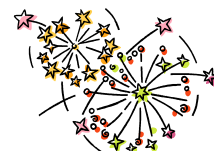

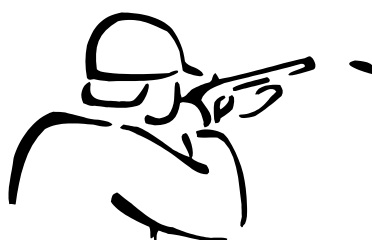


Fireworks Night
