Rousay Documentary

In 1977, 'Arena', the BBC Arts programme, decided to make a documentary about Rousay Film Society, which had won both 'Film Society of the Year' and 'Most Northerly Film Society' awards. Frank Harris and Chris Soames, representing the Committee, went to the British Film Institute ceremony in London to accept the awards.

The film only lasts approximately 10 minutes, but it is a memory of Rousay as it was - the pier before the alterations; Mansies' boat; Tingwall; The Phoenix Cinema; and, of course, many folk, some of whom are no longer with us.

The showing of 'Fiddler on the Roof' was a bit of a disaster as the distributor failed to send the wide-angled lens necessary to cinemascope projection, so it was a very blurred picture. We served hot dogs and coffee in the interval. The BBC film crew and presenter Gavin Miller were billeted in committee members' homes, and it was a bit of a culture shock to their London pads. There was a party every night and Gavin Miller was victim of a trick in which he was persuaded to blacken his face with soot without realising what he had done! Much laughter ensued and much whisky consumed during three hectic days and nights.

So if you want a laugh at the 70s' fashions and hairstyles of the hippies, and perhaps stir memories of the folk who were in the audience, then it will be shown before the showing of 127 Hours, on 15 October, at 7.40pm, at the School.
